

RELATED FIELD OR DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC FOCUS

A minimum of four courses/12 upper division (300 or 400 level) hours are required; selected in consultation with the Justice Studies' academic advisement staff; minimum grade of 'C' required.

While the Bachelor of Science in Justice Studies is a broad-based curriculum, Justice Studies' faculty requires develop an academic emphasis outside the major. Students have two options to fulfill this requirement: Related Field (RF) or Discipline Specific Focus (DSF) (current list).

Courses used for the Related Field or Discipline Specific Focus cannot be double-counted with the major (JUS), University General Studies, or Science & Society requirements. However, to encourage students to pursue a minor, concentration or concurrent major, students will be allowed to double-count the RF or DSF courses with a minor, concentration or concurrent major.
