**Dana Wolfe Naimark**, as President/CEO of the Children's Action Alliance for the past 15 years, led analyses, communications and advocacy on a wide variety of policy issues affecting children and families. She previously worked as a budget analyst for the Arizona State Legislature and as project manager for "Fiscal 2000," a year-long special legislative committee examining Arizona's tax and budget policies.

**James P. Walsh** has held the position of Pinal County Attorney since 2007 and has a long record of serving Arizonans. He has been Chief Deputy to the Arizona Attorney General and Special Counsel for Southern Arizona. Walsh has practiced law in Arizona since 1970 and has been active in many community and professional organizations.

**Eddie Sissons** serves as the first Executive Director for the Arizona Foundation for Behavioral Health. Before this, she was Program Manager for the Community Services Program in the Attorney General's office. She also served as Executive Director of a local poverty law program and as staff to the Arizona State Senate Democratic Caucus. Sissons has more than 25 years' experience in health-social-governmental-community policy settings in Arizona.
