Baccalaureate Degree Requirements

Semester Hours Required

A minimum of 120 semester hours and 45 upper-division semester hours (300 and 400 level courses) are required for a bachelor's degree.

First Year Composition Requirement

Students must demonstrate reasonable proficiency in written English by achieving a grade of "C" or better in both ENG 101 and 102 or in ENG 105 or their equivalents. Should a student receive a grade lower than "C" in any of the courses, it must be repeated until the specified proficiency is demonstrated.

General Studies Requirements

All undergraduate students are required to complete the university General Studies requirements in order to be eligible for graduation. Many general studies requirements may simultaneously fulfill major requirements.

CLAS: Graduation Requirements

The Purpose of the CLAS graduation requirements is to ensure that the student is introduced to disciplines outside of the major. Major fields of study are classified into three divisions: A. Humanities, B. Natural Sciences/Mathematics, C. Social/Behavioral Sciences.

Double Counting Restrictions:

- *You may **not** double count courses within the University General Studies Core Requirements.
- *You may **not** double count courses from the College Graduation Requirements, including the Bridge course, with the University General Studies HU, SB, SG, or SQ areas.
- *You may **not** double count courses within the College Graduation requirements, including the bridge course.

However, the L, MA, and CS requirements can be double counted in the college and major areas.

Bridge Course Requirement: (3 semester hours required)

Each student is required to complete one CLAS bridge course of at least three semester hours. Bridge courses contain substantial content that bridges at least two of the areas of inquiry noted in sections A, B, and C. Bridge courses cannot be double-counted to fill any other CLAS graduation requirement or the HU, SB, SQ, or SG portions of the General Studies requirement. Bridge courses may be double-counted with the major or Literacy and Critical Inquiry, Mathematical Studies, or any of the awareness areas when applicable.

Bachelor of Science in Justice Studies

The curriculum for the Bachelor of Science degree in Justice Studies provides interdisciplinary social-science courses relevant to law and justice for students working in the justice field, students anticipating justice-related careers (including the legal profession), and interested non-Justice Studies students. The major requires 36 semester hours all with grades of "C" or better.

Admission

Upon admission to the university, Justice Studies students are classified as preprofessional. Students must complete prerequisite courses and grade point (GPA) standards to become eligible for upper division Justice Studies courses.

Earning J-1 Status

For Justice Studies students to enroll in J-2 courses, they must earn at least a "C" in each of the JUS required courses — JUS 105 (or 305), 301, 302, and 303 — AND earn a minimum average GPA of 2.50 for these four courses.

Earning Professional Status

Justice Studies students must earn professional status before enrolling in 400-level JUS resident credit courses required for graduation. They may achieve professional status by:

- earning a minimum of 56 semester hours;
- earning a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50;
- completing the university General Studies Mathematics requirement (MA);
- completing the computer science requirement; (Choose any CS computer course such as CSE180, CIS200, EDT321 or 323)
CSE 185 is also acceptable
- completing the communication requirement; (Choose from COM100, 110, 225, 230, 241, or 259.)
- completing the following classes with a 2.50 minimum average GPA and a minimum grade of "C" in each:
 - ENG 101, 102 First-Year Comp. or ENG 105 Advanced First-Year Comp.
 - Writing req. (L)
Choose from ENG215, 216, 217, 218, or 301
 - JUS 105 Intro. to Justice Studies or JUS 305 Principles of Justice Studies
 - JUS 301 Research in Justice Studies
 - JUS 302 Basic Stat. Analysis in Justice Studies
 - JUS 303 Justice Theory

The faculty recommends that Justice Studies students take one course dealing with the American government system (for example, POS 110, 270, or 310); one Psychology course; and one Sociology course. These courses may apply to the SB core area of General Studies.
